



Some of Jesus' most famous parables are found in one Gospel, and one Gospel only. It is also the only Gospel that mentions anything about Jesus' childhood, the road to Emmaus, and that has a sequel. SAFE MINISTRY UPDATES

The Safe Ministry training day took place yesterday at St John's with around 60 people in attendance. Online Training Courses

In addition to the in-person training courses Creating Safer Communities provides online options. To help you navigate the on-line variations:

- Safe Ministry Essentials remains the introductory course for all Church workers.
- Ministry with Children is for those working with children and youth. The online version of this course now includes the core material from Module 1 meaning that workers can complete their required training with one unit rather than two. Those undertaking in-person training will still need to complete both Modules 1 & 2.
- Refresher modules are for those who have previously completed the required training, and now need an update for their ongoing clearance.
- The Top Up module has been introduced as there may be volunteers who have already completed Module 1, who are starting to work with Children and Young people. Rather than make them repeat the Safe Ministry Essential program again in the online version of Module 2, the Top Up Module 2 concentrates solely on Safe Ministry with Children and Young people without duplicating material from Module 1

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE 21 MAY 2025

Rector's Report: The Rector reported that for the redevelopment project support is required from the Diocese for Development Applications. It was agreed that the Parish would write to the Anglican Church Property Trust of the Diocese to formally brief them on the redevelopment plans. The Rector suggested that the Parish needs a co-ordinating body to oversee the redevelopment which was agreed to by Parish Council.

The Rector reported on concerns about fewer female clergy in the diocese, diocesan actions to redress this, and local efforts to ensure we encourage the ministry of women at all levels. It was generally agreed that while we should not be complacent, our parish is welcoming and supportive to women (as reflected in recent clergy appointments and the even mix of women and men across other leadership roles). There are additional initiatives afoot to give further expression to this support for the ministry of women including in ordained roles.

Finance Update: The offertory income is ahead of budget and parking is slightly above budget, year to date.

Property and Grounds Update: A new volunteer is needed to look after the rose garden. This role is being advertised in the Newsletter. Improving the outdoor lighting will be worked on. Only two quotes for the kitchen redevelopment were received and were much higher than hoped for. A midsized builder quoted \$158,800 and a larger firm quoted \$200,000. As a result, a meeting was held to discuss what should be done in relation to the redevelopment project. A number of key decisions were made. The kitchen, Robertson Room and electrical changes will be put together for a new tender to take advantage of economies of scale. The aim will be to start any building works after the Parish Fair in mid-October and increase the size of the extension to the Robertson Room and Offices.

Community Outreach: Everyone is encouraged to attend the Patronal Dinner which will be held on Wednesday 25 June from 6pm to 8pm in the Hall. Booking details can be found in the Newsletter. The Missions Committee recommended that the Parish donate funds to the Church Mission Society, Anglican Board of Missions, Bush Church Aid and the Diocesan partnership with Jose in Nigeria which Parish Council approved. They will come back to Parish Council later this year with a proposal on how to spend the rest of the funds available.

Out of the Ashes

I want to share a story that shows just how far your generosity reaches - into moments of heartbreak, and into the hope that follows.

Recently, a woman named *P* came to our Emergency Food Relief Centre after surviving a devastating house fire. While she and her two young children escaped with their lives, the smoke destroyed nearly everything they owned. Clothes, furniture, toys, schoolbooks - most of it was gone.

The trauma ran deep. P's children became fearful and anxious, struggling to sleep unless they could see their mum close by. P had to stop working - not by choice, but because her children were too frightened to be apart from her.

With no income, no belongings, and two little ones in distress, P turned to us. And because of your support, we were able to step in.

We provided nutritious food, essential supplies, and a safe space where P and her children could begin to feel steady again. We also helped her access counselling services to support their emotional recovery and referred her to **OneLink** for housing assistance and **Vinnies** for clothing and essential household items. It wasn't just about immediate relief — it was about helping P rebuild.

Gradually, things began to shift. The children are now back at school and smiling again. P has found a new home and recently started part-time work - on her own terms, with her children feeling safe and secure once more.

"You gave me strength when I had none left," she told us. "Because you were there, I could be there for my children."

This is the power of your kindness. It doesn't just fill shelves - it rebuilds lives.
