KEEPING A HOLY LENT

The forty days of Lent is a time of preparation for Easter. It recalls the forty days that Jesus spent in the wilderness. Many people set themselves a specific Lenten 'discipline' – e.g. fasting, joining a Lenten study group, reading a Christian book, studying the Scriptures more deeply, setting aside more time for prayer or recommitting themselves to weekly worship.

Ash Wednesday. Lent begins with services of Holy Communion and the Imposition of Ashes this Wednesday at 7.30am, 10am and 7.30pm.

Lenten studies. Beginning on Thursday 19 February (7pm, Robertson Room), Rev'd Dave will be leading a Lenten Study on Rowan Williams' book, 'Passions of the Soul' (Bloomsbury, 2024). A Journey of Healing, Hope, and New Beginnings

This week, I would like to share the story of one of the many resilient clients we support at St John's Care (SJC), (we shall call this client E)- a story that reminds us why community, compassion, and consistent support matter.

Following the breakdown of E's marriage, E was left to shoulder overwhelming financial responsibilities alone, including children's school fees and mortgage repayments. The emotional toll of divorce, combined with mounting debt, placed immense strain on E's wellbeing. Under this pressure, E suffered a stroke, which significantly affected her physical and mental health and forced her to stop working.

Unable to cope on her own, E moved back in with her parents and sought medical support. During this period, her challenges deepened, and she required ongoing care from a psychiatrist. At her lowest point, E struggled with thoughts of ending her life, an experience that highlights just how vulnerable people can become when faced with compounding crisis.

It was during this time that she found her way to St John's Care.

At SJC, E began receiving weekly food support, quarterly assistance with prescriptions, and school supplies when her daughter returned to school. Just as importantly, she began accessing therapeutic support - a safe space to talk, reflect, and be heard. E comes to SJC when life feels overwhelming and she needs someone to hold the space with her.

E has shared how safe she feels within our walls, describing the environment as welcoming and our volunteers as kind, compassionate, and supportive. She values being listened to without judgment and feeling understood during moments when words are hard to find.

We are pleased to share some encouraging news. E has recently been medically cleared to return to work on a part-time basis, with regular check-ins from her psychiatrist, neurologist, and GP. With improved stability, she now accesses food support fortnightly instead of weekly and has been able to clear some of her debts. She has also taken a significant step forward by moving out of her parents' home and into an apartment she can manage financially.

Her journey is one of courage, gradual healing, and renewed independence.

We are deeply grateful to our donors and supporters. Your generosity makes stories like this possible and allows SJC to continue walking alongside people as they rebuild their lives - one step at a time.




