

#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT FROM 18 JUNE 2025

Rector's Report: The Rector reported that the Redevelopment Coordination Group met for the first time to discuss the details around the redevelopment project. The 3-2-1 course went well and bootcamp has started. The young women's Bible study is going well, and Pastoral Care is getting stronger. The Rector visited Church by the Bridge in Kirribilli for professional development and had fruitful discussions with people in that Parish. A new history and archives group for the Parish will have its first meeting on 29 June 2025. The Rector presented a Memorial Donations Policy which was approved by Parish Council. The policy is designed to guide individuals or families wishing to make a donation in memory of a loved one to the Parish.

**Finance Update:** The offertory income is ahead of budget and parking is slightly under budget, year to date. A large portion of the parking fees will come in June. Parking is full now.

Property and Grounds Update: A new volunteer has been found to look after the rose garden and the June working bee went well. The previous week the Projects Team met with the Redevelopment Coordination Group to discuss the redevelopment project. The kitchen, Robertson Room and Offices will be put together in a tender to take advantage of economies of scale for contractors. St John's Care has agreed on final plans and the office design is almost finalised. The redevelopment project will be discussed further at the next Parish Council meeting at which significant decisions will need to be made. The Parish Centre electrical distribution board needs to be upgraded, which will proceed now.

Community Outreach: Parish Council was briefed on how St John's Care is going by the Chair of the St John's Care Management Committee and the Managing Director. St John's Care is an outreach mission of the Parish to help those in need. St John's Care is extremely busy at the moment and one hundred more families visited this month compared to last month. It offers support to clients in a variety of ways including case management, supporting domestic violence victims and referring people to other organisations that can assist when needed. Promoting the work St John's Care does through the media is becoming more important. The St John's Care budget for 2025-206 was approved.

#### **Gracious Connections**

It remains a privilege to serve marginalised people in my Chaplaincy and Case Management work with St John's Care. Continuous client care's value is remembered when I re-connect with people I have previously supported. Recently a client, whom for privacy purposes I will call M, came into St John's Care for emergency food relief. As I listened to this grandfather's story with empathy and compassion, I learned that this household would also benefit from bill support and clothes for the growing children in his care.

As I began to note the children's names on the clothing referral form, I realised that I had provided Chaplaincy support for them in a previous role. Yet, this was the first time I had the opportunity to speak with their kinship Guardian. As it had been a while since I had connected with his grandchildren, I shared my positive remembrance of them with their grandfather because my time working with them was a gift. He was grateful for this gracious connection. As the conversation continued, this kind-hearted and softly spoken gentleman spoke about finding hope in the healing and freedom he has found in relationship with God, despite the family's past experiences of domestic violence. Thankfully, they are safe now from harm. However, the financial challenges that result from courageously leaving such a situation are ongoing and complex for M's family.

I was positively struck by the forgiveness M showed towards people who had hurt his loved ones and encouraged to see the peace he experienced from releasing the pain and debt of wrongdoing. This is not something that is easy to do. I admire M's resilience and strength amidst it all. Like many families, M's need for support is ongoing at times. Thanks to the support of generous donors, St John's Care has been able to provide food and other practical supplies for this family as needs arise. Our charity has also been able to apply for energy bill credits successfully on the family's behalf.

I am grateful for this unexpected reconnection with M's family and trust that his grandfatherly love and personal sacrifice will continue to overcome life's challenges in safety with grace and mercy.
