


# ST JOHN'S ANGLICAN CHURCH CANBERRA

<u>Thursday September 18: Unexpected News on Suffering.</u> When we suffer, it's normal to think it's our fault, or that maybe God hates us. <u>Automating Our Parking System: Seeking Help.</u> St John's has long been blessed by volunteers who keep our ministry flourishing. One key area has been managing our parking tenants, which provides vital income for our church. Parish Council hopes to update and automate this system, and is seeking a volunteer with skills in accounting/IT integration (MYOB, databases, camera recognition) to help design and implement a new system. <u>Friends of St John's: Afternoon Tea and Evensong:</u> Rev'd Elaine Farmer OAM previously served as clergy at St John's, and is currently part of the team at St Paul's Manuka. On Sunday 14 September she will talk on the theme of *Grace*, reflecting on her journey as one of the first women ordained in this diocese. (Enabling women to serve in ordained ministry remains a key diocesan focus.)

Rev'd Elaine will speak at an afternoon tea event at 3.30pm in the Robertson Room. Afterwards, she will join us for Choral Evensong in the church (5pm). All are welcome.

Parliamentary Prayer Breakfast: 'Rejoicing in Hope'. This annual event, to be held on 3 November at 3.15pm (in the Great Hall of Parliament House) offers us a chance to pray for our members of parliament, in the presence of many political and faith leaders. This year's speaker is historian Dr John Dickson, on the theme 'rejoicing in hope'. This theme finds beautiful expression in *The First Hymn* – the oldest known Christian hymn with musical notation – preserved on a 3<sup>rd</sup> century papyrus fragment uncovered in Egypt. John Dickson, in collaboration with some top musicians and worship leaders, has now brought this ancient hymn to life.

'Predestination and Election': Book launch and signing. After Mark Warren's (parishioner and lay preacher) presentation on Predestination at St John's in 2023, several parishioners said that he should write a book. Well, here it is! Based on his Master of Theology dissertation at St Mark's, the book explores historical influences on various Bible texts, which suggest that St Paul's teaching on predestination and election may have been simpler and more comforting than we have often thought. #### The Children's Voices

I sat with a family this week and these are their voices.

We just want our family back together.

Right now, Mum (R) is living in one refuge and Dad is in another. My little brother and I go between them, but it never feels the same. We don't get to sit at the dinner table all together. We don't get to say goodnight to both Mum and Dad at the same time. We miss that more than anything.

Mum cries sometimes when she thinks we don't see. Dad tries to be strong, but we know he is hurting too. They love us so much, but everything that's happened to our family has left us all apart, and it makes the days feel so long.

We don't wish for toys or holidays. We wish for hugs, for laughter in the same room, for the chance to feel safe with both Mum and Dad close by.

St John's Care has been helping us with food, clothes, and a place to talk when things feel too heavy. They make us feel like maybe - just maybe - things can get better. But we know Mum and Dad need more help to be strong again, so we can all be together.

That's why your kindness matters so much. When you give, you don't just give food or clothes. You give us a chance to have our family back. You give Mum and Dad hope that healing is possible. You give kids like us the dream of a safe home where we can all belong.

Please, will you help families like ours find their way back to each other?
