MISSION MATTERS BY JENNIFER LAWSON

Go into all the world and preach the gospel Mark 15:16

Christmas approaches and we rejoice that it is a time to remember the birth of our Lord Jesus and the very great gift that he gives to us all. We all love giving gifts for the joy of the recipient and this year St Johns had the great privilege joining with Operation Christmas Child in their mission to children in our region by packing and sending 150 boxes filled with gifts. We may not see the surprise and excitement when they receive them but we can imagine it.

These boxes are not just a gift, they are a tangible way to show God's love to children in need, and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with them. Each box contains the opportunity to meet their eternal need as well as their current ones. Statics show that half of the children who receive a box go on to attend the twelve lessons about the gospels and, of those, half make a decision for Christ. This year St Johns introduced 70 children to Jesus and at least 35 have turned their lives over to Him and will continue to bear witness.

Operation Christmas Child started in England in October 1990, when David Cooke from Wrexham saw images of the Ceausescu orphanages in Romania in the news and was so horrified that he talked to his brother Paul and two friends, John Roberts and Dai Hughes about what they could do for these abandoned children. Their activities hit the headlines and, like the loaves and fishes, multiplied and in December that year a convoy of nine trucks departed Romania with over £600,000 of aid. In 1995 they joined forces with the American international charity Samaritan's Purse and over the past 30 years, 23 million boxes have been distributed. In 2024 211,502 boxes were sent 11,927 from Australia & NZ alone.

This year St John's sent 150 boxes. The group of parishioners who meet regularly to make items for the boxes were so encouraged that they aim to send 200 boxes in 2026 and to achieve this goal are meeting fortnightly in the Robertson Room to make things to put in the boxes. Come and see what is being achieved and join us. Next year, notices of timing etc will be in the Newsletter so keep watching for an update.

Christmas Donations bring Hope and Joy

Our Present Room is running at full steam, and in just three days we have already supported **320 families** who are doing it tough this Christmas. Every person who walks through our doors is welcomed by a staff member, and this week I had the privilege of meeting *B* - a father whose story reminded me exactly why your support matters so deeply.

B was involved in a devastating car accident last year and tragically lost his right arm. Since then, he has been unable to work. The impact on his mental health, his relationship with his wife, and their family finances has been overwhelming. He is patiently retraining himself to use his left arm for every-day tasks and shared how much we all underestimate the importance of our dominant hand. While B's wife is working full-time and carrying the load at home, B told me he feels heartbroken that he cannot provide for his family in the way he always did. On top of this, he has faced enormous barriers trying to access workers compensation, Centrelink, or any financial support. We have connected B with mental-health services, legal aid, ongoing case management, and of course, invited him into our Present Room.

When he stepped inside, he became visibly emotional. He sat down, cried, and told me how devastated he has felt knowing that he cannot afford Christmas gifts for his three children this year. He shared that he loved his job as a panel beater and always worked hard to give his family the very best. He believes that one day he will return to a job he loves, but for now, life is incredibly hard. Before leaving, B asked if he could return with his wife so they could choose the gifts together - a simple but beautiful wish that we were so glad to honour.

It is only because of generous supporters like you that families like B's can receive compassion, dignity, and hope this Christmas.


