



WHAT KINDNESS MAKES POSSIBLE

As Christmas draws near, I want to share a story that shows just how important your generosity is to families who are doing it tough right now. Over the past few weeks OUR number are already going up. Last week, one of our case managers sat with a young mum who we will call E, who has had an incredibly challenging year. E is supporting her partner through ongoing mental health struggles, which was caused by bullying at work, every dollar has been stretched to its limit. No matter how much she cut back, more bills keep coming in. Going to the letter box is a scary event that she doesn't want to do. When she talked about things we can do to support her and her family, it was the words Christmas that made her smile. E tried to hold it together but the thought of her children waking up to nothing under the tree was heartbreaking. Then she heard about our **Present Room**, opening next week. If you haven't seen our Present Room, you must come and visit it. It is a beautiful magical place this time of year. For the first time in months, she felt *hope*. She told us, "Maybe my kids can have a bit of Christmas magic after all."

This is what your kindness makes possible.

But this year, we urgently need more support to make the Present Room happen. We already have **over 90 families registered across just two days**, and more are calling every day. The cost-of-living crisis, housing insecurity, job loss, and rising medical and utility expenses mean more families than ever are turning to us. Without your help, we simply won't have enough gifts or resources to meet the demand. Last year, thanks to donors like you, we provided emergency relief to more than **11,000 people** -including food, clothing, help with medicines, utilities, and ongoing case management support. We assist people of all ages and backgrounds across the region, and none of this is possible without your generosity.
