CHURCH CENTER & PARISH DIRECTORY

You may have heard by now about Church Center, the app and website we're using to assist communication at St John's.

We recognise that not everyone loves phones and apps and technology, or wants to sign up in this way. **That's completely OK.** The information below is for those who'll find it useful.

If you've not signed up yet and would like to, download the 'Church Center' app (note the U.S. spelling!), search for 'St John the Baptist Anglican Church', and give it a go. Or, email admin@stjohnscanberra.org for a short PDF on how to proceed.

We're rolling out two new functions in Church Center that will enable us to contact each other: the **Directory**, and **Groups**.

The Directory: what you need to know. If the following seems a little cumbersome, that's because we're ensuring the security of your details, your control over your details, and your decisions about to whom you'll respond.

- A 'Directory' icon now appears at the bottom of the Church Center app. *(You can also access it on a computer through the web. But we'll focus here on the app.)*
- You'll only appear in the Directory if you are enrolled in Church Center **and then ask to join** the Directory (see below).
- If you join, others will be able to contact you, but **via email only**. Your email address is initially hidden from them.
- In the Directory, you click on 'Contact [person's name]'. You write a note in the app, which then goes to their email inbox. They'll then respond to you (or not) **via email (not via the app)**.
- When you *receive* a contact in this way, it's up to you whether to reply to their email. (If you're not sure who someone is, you can always check with church staff before replying.)
- We strongly suggest you'd **only** share a phone number, or anything

else, **with someone you know**.

- You cannot be contacted via the Directory if you've not entered an email address into Church Center. It relies on email addresses.
- Phone numbers and email addresses **will never appear** in the Directory.

To join the Directory, after you've enrolled in Church Center (see above), you need to do **three things**:

1. Email Jane at admin@stjohnscanberra.org, and ask for an 'invitation' to join.
2. You'll receive an email from 'St John the Baptist Anglican Church <no_reply@churchcenter.com>' (check your spam folder!). In that email, click 'Yes, share my information'.
3. In the app, go to your 'information and settings', then to 'Directory Listing'. Select 'Allow others to contact me', and hit 'Update'. (You might also like to share your photo, as an aid to us getting to know one another.)

That's it. You should then be able to contact others, and be contacted.

Groups. Groups are a powerful function allowing smaller groups within St John's to communicate with each other—this time, *through* the app (and so reducing endless emails).

It will also enable you to share resources, advertise meeting details, and do some other things.

If your small group (e.g. a Bible study group; volunteer workers' group; music team; catering team, etc.) would like access to that function, let Rev'd Andrew know, or email admin@stjohnscanberra.org.

There'll be some policies you'll need to know and observe. But this aspect of Church Center will be very useful.

Of course, you need to be enrolled in Church Center to use the Groups function. However, you can be in a group *without* also being in the Directory.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT June 2026

The most recent Parish Council meeting was held in the evening on Wednesday 17 June at which several issues were discussed. A summary is provided below.

Rector's Report: The Rector briefed Councillors on a range of matters including an updated Safe Ministry policy relating to Kids and Family Ministry, information regarding making bequests to St John's, and columbarium pricing options (which would allow non-parishioners to buy a niche). It was agreed that the columbarium policy be amended to allow sales to non-parishioners at a higher price than parishioners pay and that one-third of the niches in the new extension be reserved for parishioners. This will be reviewed again in twelve months.

The Rector reported that a great evening was expected for the Patronal Dinner on 18 June. There has been little interest in the advertised Children and Families Worker role. He is working with the current Children and Families Worker to plan to cover this gap for upcoming Term 3.

Finance Update: The Treasurer reported that while our year-to-date revenue and parking revenue have improved, both are still below budget. Thanks to the generosity of parishioners, offertories were above budget for May 2026 and higher than the same period last year. In relation to the performance of the trust funds, the Treasurer noted correspondence explaining an error in the trust investment reports and that the trust portfolio actually returned 8.28% for the period. The Rector will ask for the reports to be reissued.

Property and Grounds Update: The Chair of the Property Committee briefed Councillors on several meetings held in relation to the Parish Centre extension project. The documentation for the submission of the Works Approval for the Robertson Room and Offices extension is progressing. It is hoped that all the reports will be ready within a couple of weeks. However, another meeting was required with the Quantity Surveyor regarding the St John's Care Redevelopment to clarify requirements and costings. Updates were also provided on key maintenance issues.

Community Outreach: The Managing Director of St John's Care attended the Parish Council meeting, briefing members on their work as part of the Parish's important outreach in the community. Supporting a range of clients, St John's Care provides food, case management and support to many in the region. He presented the proposed St John's Care budget for 2026/2027 in detail and after discussion, it was approved by Parish Council. All parishioners are invited to attend the monthly community lunches held on the first Friday of the month from

12pm to 1.30pm in the Hall. Come for lunch and fellowship.

A Warm Welcome for a New Family

Last month, St John's Care welcomed a family of five who had recently arrived in Canberra. The family, made up of two parents and their three children, had relocated in the hope of creating a better future and accessing greater educational opportunities for their children. After just two months in Canberra, they found themselves struggling to establish their new home. They had moved into an empty house with very few belongings and were facing the challenge of Canberra's cold winter without adequate clothing, bedding, or furniture. Like many families starting over, they were doing their best but needed a helping hand. St John's Care was able to provide immediate food relief, along with blankets and warm clothing from our community clothing rack to help the family through their first weeks. We also connected them with our valued community partners to ensure they received ongoing support. A referral was made to Thread Together to provide clothing for the adults, while Roundabout Canberra assisted with clothing for the children. We also referred the family to St Vincent de Paul (Vinnies) for furniture assistance to help furnish their home and provided information about Companion House so they could access additional settlement and wellbeing services available in the community. The family was incredibly grateful for the support they received from St John's Care and our partner organisations. The parents expressed how much the practical assistance and referrals meant to them during such a challenging time, while the children were excited to receive warm clothing and experience the kindness of the Canberra community.

Last Friday, the family joined us for our *Christmas in July celebration*. It was wonderful to see them enjoying a delicious meal, meeting other members of the community, and sharing in the festive atmosphere. Seeing the smiles on the children's faces was a reminder that support is about much more than providing food or essential items it is about creating a sense of belonging and helping families feel welcomed into their new community. Stories like this are only possible because of the generosity of our donors, volunteers, and community partners. Your support allows us to respond quickly when families are in need, providing not only practical assistance but also hope, dignity, and the reassurance that they are not alone. Thank you for helping St John's Care give families like this one the opportunity to begin a new chapter with warmth, security, and confidence.
