Escaping to safety

As the nights draw in and the coming mornings are crisp, we are reminded of the frailty and vulnerability of many of our clients. Whilst many of us are fortunate to be able to pay for our food, clothing needs and utility bills, many of our clients are already struggling with these life 'basics.'

How difficult it is for someone to have to ask for the very basics in life. For example, warm clothing, help to pay for electricity or even to ask for the provision of bedding, towels, or a bus ticket home. At St John's Care we endeavour to provide a friendly face, a hot drink, some biscuits, time to share, case management and counselling if required.

One such family who St John's Care are currently supporting have escaped a wartorn situation in their overseas village. We shall call them Family B. Originally St John's Care were supporting the mother of Family B. While she endeavoured to make a new life in Canberra, she also supported her son to start catering training in Canberra. This was to enable him to return to his wife and three children in his overseas village.

Family B had made their plan for better there. Now the separated family were in danger and were required to flee to Australia. This journey to safety has been fraught with physical and mental distress. Family B continue to work through all the legal requirements to remain in Australia. This family of five are now staying in their aged family member's small two bedroom unit, resulting in a very cramped and difficult living environment.

St John's Care continues to support Family B with emergency relief food, clothing, bedding, blankets, towels, further referrals, bus tickets to attend immigration meetings, complex case management including advocacy for schooling and housing, explanations of legal requirements and therapeutic conversations.

St John's Care often steps into the gap where many agencies may not be able to support a family. The St John's Care team continue to be very thankful for the generosity of spirit, time, and donations that our amazing Canberra family supply.

Thank you very much for maintaining your support of Canberra's vulnerable by partnering with St John's Care.

BARNABAS' BAPTISM TESTIMONY

Barnabas Walker was baptised last week. Here is an abridged version of some words he shared.

After Dave asked me to speak at my baptism, I googled 'what to include in my testimony' and prayed that God would help me fill out an online scaffold. I was told to start by talking about my life before Christ.

That's a little hard because since I was born, I have been surrounded by loving Christians, role modelling to me the values of Christ. I was told the good news at church, school and at home. I was enthusiastic, but thinking about it now, I'm not sure I truly understood God, or even Christianity. When I had questions beyond 'did Noah have dinosaurs on the ark?" I felt uncomfortable. I wondered why my faith wasn't as good as everyone else's and what was wrong with me.

As I left my Christian childhood and ventured out into a big, secular high school, I found myself torn between my little, confused faith and a deep desire to fit in. I made the wrong choice. I deliberately turned my back on God, thinking I – a 14 year old – had come to a brilliant, logical, enlightened, secular understanding of the world.

I didn't go far off the rails or become a problem child. What I did have was a quiet hole deep down and often ignored. I slowly realised that I was missing something.

Over the course of two years, I had little experience of faith – just reading my Bible one night, or accidentally referring to the church as "us" during a conversation. Seeing the brilliant testimony and living Christian faith, in person and online, pushed me over the edge. I recognised what I was missing in my life and decided that I wanted to come home.

Around Christmas, Mum and I had a conversation, where we decided to look for a church together. To be honest it didn't take that long to settle. Coming to St John's it felt so right. There was the occasional awkwardness of meeting new people, but that was always cushioned by an underlying warmth and kindness.

Coming into this place has grown my knowledge of and relationship with God, to my Church family I want to say thank you. To my actual family, I want to say thank you.

Next, according to the formula, I'm meant to talk about my life "after coming to Christ" but to be honest I don't think I have the perspective to talk about that yet. What I hope is that I continue this journey with you.
