Supporting Ministry at St John's. As a new year begins, please take a moment prayerfully to consider the appropriate level of your regular financial contribution to our parish. We are highly dependent upon regular (preferably automatic) deposits to sustain our growing ministry and care for our site. Kids and Youth in 2026. Our program for young people (yrs k-10) will recommence on 8 February at our 9.30am service, with 'Start Up Sunday' – a fun day with a waterslide, ice cream, and family BBQ after our 9.30am service.

Our overflow space and cry room will continue to function in the Robertson Room in 2026 during the 9.30am service, to assist families with younger children who may find this space easier.

For older youth, our 6pm service will continue its 'youth check in' after church – a chance to talk about faith and encourage each other.

New appointments. We offer a hearty thanks to Jennifer Lawson for her excellent service as Sacristan over the past 3 years, and welcome Kim Gibson (8am service) as she steps into this role.

Another area of change this year is in our flower team. Sanya Ritchie has retired after several decades of exceptional service. Barbara Griffiths is now coordinating the Flower Team, with support from Chris Creelman (Easter and Christmas boxes). Please make these new leaders feel welcome and support them as you are able.

AGM and Elections. Our parish AGM and Electoral Meeting will be held on Sunday 22 March. From 11.00am, Alan Wilson (parish archivist) will present some historic photos of the parish and speak briefly about his role as archivist. From 11.30am the meeting itself will begin. We

encourage all parishioners to engage with the significant and exciting matters facing the parish in the year ahead.

Elections will be held for parish councillors, peoples' wardens, and representatives for our Clergy Appointments Board and Synod. Those wishing to nominate someone for these positions should do so using the nominations form in the church foyer and depositing it in the collections box no later than Sunday 15 March.

New kitchen. We expect work on our new (refurbished) parish kitchen to be completed this month. We are grateful for this much-needed improvement to parish infrastructure and appreciate your flexibility as we manage the temporary inconvenience.

Lenten study. Beginning on Thursday 19 February (7pm, Robertson Room), Rev'd Dave will be leading a Lenten Study on Rowan Williams' book, 'Passions of the Soul' (Bloomsbury, 2024). 15 copies have been ordered for quick purchase—others will need to order their own. SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

9.30 Kids' Church – help us serve! Kids' Church at St John's provides teaching, discipleship, and community to the members of our parish aged between 4 years and 11 years.

It can be easy to see these parishioners as almost separate from those who sit in for the whole 9:30am service. Yet these children are very much members of our parish. Through Kids' Church they are learning how to love Jesus and live their lives as His followers – just as you are during a service. They are learning how to be loving servants in a thriving community – just as you are. They are learning how church “works” even in the short time they sit amongst you each Sunday.

We can never forget that what we do today sows seeds for their earthly future, and their eternal life. They are the ones who will be sitting in the pews after we are long gone, the ones who will be part of the choir after us, or part of the working bees maintaining the grounds, serving morning tea, writing and sharing intercessions. They will pass on the

history of St John's, tend to the churchyard, and maybe, be the Rector! We cannot see what God has planned for these members of our parish, but we can be part of the story of their faith.

Kids' Church is a fun, and rewarding ministry and I would love for you to join our Kids' Church team. You will receive big smiles, excited greetings, hear of amazing triumphs, and get asked profound questions.

We have a growing ministry and are at least 3 people short. If you are hesitant about your "qualifications", please do not let that stop you – we can provide training and support! Bumpy Road Ahead

G is someone we have walked alongside for some time at St John's Care. Like many people we support, his journey has not been a straight line. Recently, G returned to the Centre during a particularly difficult chapter of his life.

After a period of relapse into old and problematic alcohol and other substance use, G experienced significant harm. During this time, he was assaulted and spent several days in hospital recovering from his injuries. When he came through our doors again, he was seeking something very simple, yet deeply human: food, safety, and someone to talk to.

It was clear that G was experiencing a significant low. He spoke openly about the weight of recent events and the disappointment he felt in himself. Moments like these remind us that recovery is rarely linear, and setbacks do not erase the progress a person has made or the strength they carry.

St John's Care has been able to support G in practical and meaningful ways. We provided basic food assistance to help meet his immediate needs, ensuring he had access to nourishment while he focused on recovery. Alongside this, we supported G to navigate complex health and legal systems following his hospitalisation, helping him understand his options and attend to important appointments and paperwork.

Recognising that G's needs extend beyond what any one service can offer, we have also worked to connect him with specialist services, including referrals to organisations with expertise in alcohol and other drug support, health care, and ongoing recovery. Just as importantly, we have offered time, compassion, and a safe space to talk, something that can make all the difference during moments of deep vulnerability.

There is a long road back for G. It is a road that will undoubtedly include both ups and downs, moments of hope and moments of struggle.

At St John's Care, we remain committed to standing alongside G, offering practical support and human connection as he finds his footing once more. His story is reminder to refrain from judging setbacks, and instead to be present in them, and to hold space for hope even when it feels hard to see.


